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BORDEAUX

Excellent 2019 vintage is approachable and age-worthy

The 2019 vintage in Bordeaux was in the middle of what we now know was a trio of great vintages. They were all different: 2018 was big and tannic, 2020 was full of fruit. 2019 was a combination of the two: bold ripe fruits, almost opulent in character, reminiscent, say those with a memory of these things, of 2009, which was a big hit in the American market.

I wrote in 2020, as I tasted the wines taken from barrel (*en primeur* in French), that these are wines for enjoyment. And so it has proved. They are accessible while also having the structure necessary for aging. As so often in recent vintages, the wines with a good proportion of

either Cabernet Sauvignon or Cabernet Franc in the blend are the best. Merlot, for all its pleasures, had too much alcohol from the heat.

I enjoyed the wines at *en primeur* and I have enjoyed them again now. It is the uniformity that is most pleasing. Even the lesser estates, those where the wines sell for \$20 or less, are

worth buying. I have already reported on these in 2021 and earlier this year. In this issue, the reviews concentrate on the grandest wines, some of which have prices approaching \$1,000 a bottle.

Although even here there are bargains. Many classed growths from the Médoc with scores

comfortably in the mid-90s are available for well under \$100. And don't forget the area just south of Bordeaux city, Pessac-Léognan. These wines sing. In 2019, the reds are just right, especially from the higher scoring estates. While the Pessac-Léognan whites from this warm year are less interesting, they are certainly the best whites to

come out of Bordeaux in 2019.

The wines will age, and age well. The top reds should be ready in the late 2020s, others from 2025 or maybe 2026. Alcohol levels are more moderate than they were in 2018. All in all, a vintage for pleasure.

91 **Château Petit Boyer 2020 Cuvée Paloma (Blaye Côtes de Bordeaux).** This ripe, wood aged wine has rich tannins encased by black fruits and generous acidity and structure. It has weight and concentration with a dry core and fine juicy berry flavors at the end. Drink from 2025. W. Direct. **Cellar Selection.** —R.V.

90 **Château Petit Boyer 2020 Cuvée Armand (Blaye Côtes de Bordeaux).** Aged in wood for eight months, this dense wine is dominated by generous Merlot. They give spice, juicy black currant fruits and potential. The wine is set for further aging. Drink from 2025. W. Direct. —R.V.

89 **Château Luc de Beaumont 2019 Blaye Côtes de Bordeaux.** Smooth tannins and juicy black fruits come together in this open, fruity wine. Its structure is well integrated with the fruits, that shine through the wine touched by pepper from the alcohol. Drink from 2025. Tri-Vin Imports. —R.V.

88 **Château Cambrochets 2020 Blaye Côtes de Bordeaux.** A ripe and structured wine, this has ripe tannins and generous black currant fruits. Its structure and juicy fruits are well balanced with some smoky flavors. Drink from 2024. Wine Source International. —R.V.

88 **Château Luc de Beaumont 2020 Blaye Côtes de Bordeaux.** Dark and densely textured, this wine's black fruit flavors are supplemented by dark chocolate. Still very young, it has a heavy

feeling, the solid Merlot giving weight. Drink from 2026. Tri-Vin Imports. —R.V.

87 **Château Puy de Lignac 2020 Blaye Côtes de Bordeaux.** This 80% Merlot wine has ripe, spicy flavors along with layers of wood and black fruits. It is a ripe wine, shaped by a firm structure over succulent berry flavors. The wine will be ready from 2025. Vinamericas, Inc.. —R.V.

90 **Château la Freynelle 2019 Emotion (Bordeaux).** Véronique Barthe, the owner and winemaker of La Freynelle, has produced this cuvée. The blend of Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon comes from the best parcels of the estate. It is rich, dense and full of blackberry fruits. It should age a little more, drink from 2023. Aquitaine Wine Company. —R.V.

88 **Château Bellevue 2020 Bordeaux.** The wine's rich texture is spiced by the wood aging flavors. Blueberries and firm tannins surge from the wine. The 65% Merlot and 25% of the two Cabernets give structure and some aging potential. Drink from 2024. Saranty Imports. **Best Buy.** —R.V.

88 **Château Dauzac 2020 D de Dauzac (Bordeaux).** While Château Dauzac is in Margaux, this little sibling comes from vines across the track in Bordeaux appellation. It's a black currant flavored wine with a fresh streak of acidity and a lightly structured aftertaste. Drink from 2023. Misa Imports. **Best Buy.** —R.V.

88 **Château Grand Jean 2019 Le Veggio (Bordeaux).** A ripe and smooth wine, generous in its black fruits and spice, this immediately attractive and ready to drink. Spice from the touch of wood aging offers complexity. Drink now. Suitable for vegans. Lompian Wines. —R.V.

88 **Château Lauduc 2020 L'InVINCible (Bordeaux).** Bottled without added sulfur, the wine comes from a single parcel in the 135 acre Lauduc vineyard. It is still young with black currant freshness and acidity. The wine needs some more time to soften, so drink from 2024. Lanterna Distributors Inc. —R.V.

88 **Château Rauzan Despaigne 2019 Bordeaux.** Ripe tannins and soft black fruits come together in this open and friendly wine. Acidity adds its freshness to the wine's balance and spicy

If a wine was evaluated by a single reviewer, that taster's initials appear following the note. When no initials appear following a wine review, the wine was evaluated by two or more reviewers and the score and tasting note reflect the input of all tasters. Unless otherwise stated, all spirit reviews are by Kara Newman and all beer reviews are by John Holl.

Each review contains a score, the full name of the product, its suggested national retail price, its alcohol (abv) as reported to us by the submitter and a tasting note. If price or alcohol content cannot be confirmed, NA (not available) will be printed. Prices are for 750-ml bottles unless otherwise indicated.

TASTING METHODOLOGY AND GOALS

All tastings reported in the Buying Guide are performed blind. Typically, products are tasted in peer-group flights of from 5–8 samples. Reviewers may know general information about a flight to provide context—vintage, variety or appellation—but never the producer or retail price of any given selection. When possible, products considered flawed or uncustomary are retasted.

ABOUT THE SCORES

Ratings reflect what our editors felt about a particular product. Beyond the rating, we encourage you to read the accompanying tasting note to learn about a product's special characteristics.

- Classic 98–100:** The pinnacle of quality.
- Superb 94–97:** A great achievement.
- Excellent 90–93:** Highly recommended.
- Very Good 87–89:** Often good value; well recommended.
- Good 83–86:** Suitable for everyday consumption; often good value.
- Acceptable 80–82:** Can be employed in casual, less-critical circumstances.

Products deemed Unacceptable (receiving a rating below 80 points) are not reviewed.

SPECIAL DESIGNATIONS

Editors' Choice products are those that offer excellent quality at a price above our Best Buy range, or a product at any price with unique qualities that merit special attention.

Cellar Selections are products deemed highly collectible and/or requiring time in a temperature-controlled wine cellar to reach their maximum potential. A Cellar Selection designation does not mean that a product must be stored to be enjoyed, but that cellaring will probably result in a more enjoyable bottle. In general, an optimum time for cellaring will be indicated.

Best Buys are products that offer a high level of quality in relation to price. Wines meriting this award are generally priced at \$15 or less, and are designated Best Buys after surpassing a specific quality-to-price ratio benchmark.


98 Three Sticks 2020 Gap's Crown Vineyard Chardonnay (Sonoma Coast).

A creamy mouthfeel of exuberant nuttiness is met by an undercurrent of fresh lemon, tangerine and peach in this highly impressive coastal wine. Deliciously balanced, complex and layered, it exhibits length, breadth and tremendous beauty, exceptional in every way. —V.B.

97 Castello di Neive 2019 Albesani Santo Stefano (Barbaresco).

Fragrant and refined, this compelling red has aromas of woodland berry, ground pepper, camphor and tilled earth. Full-bodied and structured, the youthfully tense palate features ripe red cherry, pomegranate, star anise and ground nutmeg. Tight, fine-grained tannins and vibrant acidity provide support and energy. It shows great aging potential. Drink 2029–2039. Winebow Imports. **Cellar Selection.** —K.O.

97 Lynmar Estate 2020 Monastery Chardonnay (Russian River Valley).

Juicy in a depth of fig and pear, this white is beautifully smooth and supple, with layers of richness that are balanced and bright in acidity. Entirely barrel fermented, it holds its oak with ease and elegance, allowing it to quietly add a twist of baking spice, vanilla bean and honeycomb. —V.B.


97 Niner 2019 Jespersen Ranch Pinot Noir (Edna Valley).

There's an incredible, intense aroma of cherry paste on the nose, as well as mint, loam and geranium scents that add complexity. Black cherry sorbet, dark mint and sweet oak element are framed by sandy tannins on the palate, which unfolds into a mesmerizing display of texture and flavors. Drink now–2039. **Cellar Selection.** —M.K.

96 Three Sticks 2020 One Sky Chardonnay (Sonoma Mountain).

From an estate vineyard at 2,300-foot-elevation above the fog, this exquisite white is floral and bursting in anise and honey. With a balanced approach and seamless mouthfeel, it is lengthy and complex, with beautifully light layers of peach, pear and toast. —V.B.


96 Vasse Felix 2020 Heytesbury Chardonnay (Margaret River).

This vintage—more restrained than previous ones—offers notes of white peach fuzz, toasty vanilla oak, beeswax, ginger spice and a wet stone nuance. The nut and oak spice is more prominent on the palate, but a crystalline acidity and a long citrus and stone fruit finish beautifully balances the oak influence. Restrained and elegant with freshness and length, this should cellar well into the 2040s. Winebow Imports. —C.P.




95 Benovia 2019 Cohn Vineyard Estate Pinot Noir (Sonoma County). This incredibly delicious and complex wine is full of tension and texture, inviting in every way. White pepper, rose and great red fruit combine for a blockbuster of memorable flavor and a length of supple tannin—the oak adding a touch of baking spice that complements the balanced richness. *Editors' Choice.* —V.B.


95 Blue Farm 2019 Farmhouse Estate Farmed Pinot Noir (Carneros). Floral and complete in tension and energy, this is a high-acid, brightly fruited wine, complex in every way. Moderate concentration binds it to a robust structure and sinewy tannins, with impressive length and finesse. . —V.B.

95 Bonterra 2020 The Butler, Butler Ranch Vineyard (Mendocino County). Big, broad aromas of black fruit, black pepper and woodsmoke give way to well-saturated black-cherry, tar and singed rosemary flavors in this dramatic and concentrated wine. Tightly knit tannins add great structure to the mouthfeel, setting the wine up for a long life. Best from 2026–2036. *Cellar Selection.* —J.G.


95 Daou 2020 Solomon Hills Vineyard Pinot Noir (Santa Maria Valley). There's a compelling combination of rich boysenberry fruit and complex layers of bay leaf, tree bark, eucalyptus oil and hard spices on the nose of this bottling. The powerful palate packs roasted berry flavors with sagebrush, toasted oak and wild thyme. —M.K.

95 Daou 2019 Soul of a Lion Cabernet Sauvignon (Adelaida District). Toasted espresso-bean, charred walnut-shell and seared meat aromas ride atop a dark cassis tone, all contributing to the portrait of a brooding wine. That classic toasty, woody element spreads through the palate, as dark-cocoa dust sprinkled across rich berry-sauce flavors get a light pop of mint on the finish. —M.K.


95 Domaine des Baumard 2018 Clos du Papillon (Savennières). Slowly developing, this wine from the butterfly (papillon) shaped vineyard is impressive. Its mineral character and its tight acidity are harbingers of long-term aging. The white fruits and tight texture will soften over time. Drink this fine wine from 2025. Vintus LLC. *Cellar Selection.* —R.V.


95 FEL 2020 Savoy Vineyard Pinot Noir (Anderson Valley). Very ripe fruit and an impression of sweetness pervade this fully ripe, rich and delicious wine from a noted site. Soft tannins and a full body embrace red and black cherries, spearmint and redwood forest nuances for an indulgent and complex expression. Best from 2027. *Cellar Selection.* —J.G.

95 Gainey 2020 Limited Selection Pinot Noir (Sta. Rita Hills). Lovely layers of raspberry, smashed currant, earthy mints and potpourri make for a dynamic nose on this bottling. The palate snaps with immediate, grapefruit-peel-like acidity, then slowly unfurls into black-cherry-framboise flavors laced with white pepper, hard spice and toasty oak into an extended finish. —M.K.

95 Goldeneye 2019 Gowan Creek Vineyard Pinot Noir (Anderson Valley). This sleek and subtle wine offers great balance, classic aromas and flavors and a good sense of structure that will help it improve over time. Concentrated but restrained red and black cherries, black currants, mint and light oak spices give it plenty to savor, and should develop even more from 2025. *Editors' Choice.* —J.G.

95 Goldeneye 2019 Ten Degrees Pinot Noir (Anderson Valley). Complex, toasty and rich, this full-bodied wine blended from select vineyards offers potent black-cherry and blackberry flavors accented by light woodsmoke and cinnamon. Moderate tannins give it a good grip on the palate and, with the wine's excellent concentration, suggest a good aging curve. Best from 2025–2030. —J.G.

95 Hawk and Horse Vineyards 2019 Block 3 Cabernet Sauvignon (Red Hills). This powerful but composed wine should have a long life ahead and get more complex each year. Its ultraconcentrated black-currant flavors and subtle, integrated oak spices are gently and firmly wrapped in fine-grained tannins. Best from 2025–2035. **Cellar Selection.** —J.G.


95 Justin 2018 Isosceles Cabernet Sauvignon (Paso Robles). Roasted meat, preserved plum and smoke aromas make for a pleasantly rugged nose on this bottling, which includes 9% Merlot and 8% Cabernet Franc. The palate is rugged and rich as well, with teriyaki, baked black-plum and smoked meat flavors, with acid washing into the finish. —M.K.


95 Kenzo Estate 2021 Asatsuyu Sauvignon Blanc (Napa Valley). This beautiful white includes 4.5% Sémillon, the wine barrel-aged in equal parts neutral French oak and stainless steel. Rounded and expansive on the palate, it is balanced in terms of acidity and fruit, with flavors of pear, peach and hibiscus giving in to a hint of vanilla that lingers on a long, rich finish. —V.B.

95 Lail 2019 Georgia Sauvignon Blanc (Napa Valley). Fermented and aged 21 months in French oak, 70% of it new, this sophisticated, complex and structured white is from a three-acre site that is dry-farmed. Viscous, textured and high-toned, it has flavors of lemon peel, wet stone and grapefruit as well as an earthy embrace of dried herb and lemongrass. —V.B.

95 Lynmar Estate 2020 Susanna's Vineyard Chardonnay (Sonoma Coast). A barrel-fermented white from an estate coastal site, this wine is broad across the palate in tingling acidity, fresh and crisp throughout a textured body of great tension and energy. Apple, pear and a hint of citrus combine around an earthiness that endures throughout. —V.B.

95 Sullivan 2019 Estate Grown Cabernet Sauvignon (Rutherford). Blended with 9% Petit Verdot, this estate wine is juicy, broadly expansive and grippy in tannin, with strong, rich layers of cassis, dark cherry and oak. Aged 21 months in all new French oak, it offers a spicy earthiness of clove, tobacco and dried herb that accent the fruit and texture with ease. Enjoy best from 2029–2034. **Cellar Selection.** —V.B.

95 Three Sticks 2020 Durell Vineyard Origin Chardonnay (Sonoma Coast). Fermented and aged in concrete egg and amphora, this wine is built to showcase the high quality and complexity of the famous estate site, and it does, with ease. Pear, apple blossom and quince highlight a core of lengthy acidity that accentuates notes of flint and stone. The finish offers a lovely parting note of richness that endures. —V.B.

95 Three Sticks 2020 Pinot Noir (Russian River Valley). Stemmy, with a nice depth of fruit, this wine is textured and lengthy, with a delicious core of raspberry, cherry and tangy blood orange. It remains fresh throughout, showing just a touch of lushness and balanced richness, finishing in spice and cola. —V.B.

95 Three Sticks 2020 Price Family Estates Pinot Noir (Sonoma Coast). A blend of six estate coastal sites, this wine is broadly juicy, broad and richly layered. Blue and red fruit are complemented by black tea, subtle oak and supple tannin, complex yet immediately delicious and decadently balanced. —V.B.



94 Bella 2019 Dupratt Vineyard Zinfandel (Mendocino Ridge). This bold and complex wine made from 100-year-old vines is laced with herb and spice aromas from thyme to rosemary and wood smoke, on top of vivid blackberry and black-cherry flavors. A full body and moderate tannins give a grippy mouthfeel while black-pepper and wild-sage kick in on the finish. *Editors' Choice.* —J.G.

94 Bonterra 2020 The McNab Cabernet Sauvignon (Mendocino County). This potent but sophisticated wine combines powerful, focused black-fruit flavors with restrained mint, toast and cocoa accents, cradled by fine-grained tannins that help it glide smoothly through the palate and lingering finish. Boosted by 20% Petite Sirah, it will drink best from 2025–2035. *Cellar Selection.* —J.G.



94 Brassfield 2019 Estate Petit Verdot (High Valley). A powerful core of black fruits and graphite is wrapped in moderate, velvety tannins that shape and polish it well. Hints of vanilla, dark chocolate and black cherries are revealed with repeated sipping. This full-bodied wine will be best through 2030. *Cellar Selection.* —J.G.



94 Calera 2019 Jensen Vineyard Pinot Noir (Mt. Harlan). Rugged cherry aromas meet with earth herbs, star anise and gamy charcuterie on the nose of this bottling, which was grown in true limestone at 2,200 feet. That rugged character rolls through the palate, featuring wild plums, salted meat, bay leaf and wood oil, with enough texture and acidity to last awhile. Drink now—2039. *Cellar Selection.* —M.K.

94 Cliff Lede 2021 Sauvignon Blanc (Napa Valley). This is an outstanding white blend of 90% Sauvignon Blanc with 9% Sémillon and 1% Sauvignon Vert. Bright and fresh in peach and wet stone, it is nicely textured, with just enough weight and breadth to add complexity and structure. *Editors' Choice.* —V.B.

94 Domaine Carneros 2018 Brut Rosé (Carneros). Made from 58% estate-grown Pinot Noir and 42% estate-grown Chardonnay, and given a minimum of three years of aging, this vintage-dated sparkler offers aromas of fresh hay. On the palate, it reveals lovely, light layers of barely ripe strawberry, orange peel and grapefruit that are lengthy with a delectable mouthfeel. —V.B.



94 Famiglia Anselma 2017 del Comune di Monforte d'Alba (Barolo). Camphor, leather, underbrush and toasted nut aromas mingle with pipe tobacco on this full-bodied red. Showing the heat of the vintage, the full-bodied palate offers dried cherry, ground clove and star anise framed in close-grained, drying tannins. Drink 2025–2032. Crus & Stills. *Editors' Choice.* —K.O.



94 Fess Parker 2020 Bien Nacido Vineyard Chardonnay (Santa Maria Valley). The delicate yet detailed nature of this bottling is immensely appealing, starting with aromas of crisp nectarine, blanched almond and sea salt. The palate is quite complex, with familiar lemon-zest, white-flower and apple-peel touches, but also a more exotic streak of ginger. —M.K.

94 Grey Wolf Cellars 2019 Lineage (Paso Robles). Clean and rounded aromas of blackberry jam, delicate licorice, roasted strawberry and a hint of wood show on the nose of this blend of 44% Cabernet Sauvignon, 28% Malbec, 24% Merlot and 4% Petit Verdot. There's a firm, chalky grip to the sip, where rich flavors of blackberry, cocoa and pepper ride a fresh acidity into the long finish. Drink now–2031. *Cellar Selection.* —M.K.

94 GRO Wines 2019 Cabernet Sauvignon (Rutherford). With 8% Cabernet Franc, this small-production wine from Star Vineyard is elegantly woven in lavender, bay leaf and black pepper. Rounded, elongated tannins surround blue fruit, dust and a lightness of spice, with a plush, deep and lengthy palate of great complexity. —V.B.


94 Hawk and Horse Vineyards 2019 Cabernet Franc (Red Hills). Absolutely lush and mouthcoating, this superconcentrated and deeply colored wine made with organic grapes overflows with blueberries, black currants and dark chocolate. Its abundant tannins are velvety, warmly wrapping up the rich fruit and spice flavors. Best from 2026–2032. *Cellar Selection.* —J.G.

Young cognac deserves some love, too

In Cognac, the longest-aged (and often fanciest-looking and most expensive) expressions tend to get the most attention. Yet, the youngest versions of France's signature brandy deserve some love, too.

VS Cognac—aka “Very Special” Cognac—must be aged for a minimum of two years, according to the Bureau National Interprofessionnel du Cognac (BNIC), which represents the Cognac appellation. The label may also say “Selection,” “De Luxe,” or may simply have three stars (***) to designate the VS category. Specifically, that means the youngest eau-de-vie (distillate) used to create the blend was aged in oak barrels for at least two years. Older eau-de-vie may be part of the blend too; Cognac producers typically blend together eau-de-vie of various ages.

For reference, VSOP is aged a minimum of 4 years; XO a minimum of 10 years; XXO a minimum of 12 years; and Reserve a minimum of 25 years.

It's affordable, it's mixable, and it can be a great starting point if you want to work your way through to the older expressions.

So what makes VS worth a look? It's affordable, it's mixable, and it can be a great starting point if you want to work your way through to the older expressions of a particular brand.

To be clear, VS Cognacs can be a little on the fiery side compared to longer-aged counterparts that have had significant time to mel-

low. But they can also show a lively framework of fruit and spice, not yet cloaked in too much vanilla and caramel from accumulated barrel time. It can be like a glimpse of a gawky colt before it ages into a thoroughbred.

And as the well-preserved French of “a certain age” demonstrate that age can be just a number, this month's reviews

also include a selection of non-age statement (NAS) Cognacs. NAS has become a staple in the world of single malt whiskeys—a trend that began when demand spiked and older whiskeys were harder to source—but it's not often seen in Cognac. —Kara Newman

95 Larsen Aqua Ignis Cognac (France; Marussia Beverages USA, Cedar Knolls, NJ). This Cognac is aged in barrels that are “steam-toasted,” meaning it's immersed in water, then toasted. The end result is a deep amber hue and pleasing hazelnut, cocoa and vanilla on nose and palate. Hints of dried cherry and date lead into a nutmeg and cinnamon-flecked finish. Enjoy alongside a dessert pairing or mix into cocktails. No age statement.

BEER

Don't be afraid of the dark lager revival

While it might be too soon to call it a renaissance, there is definitely renewed interest in dark lagers. Brewers, who have long enjoyed the various styles in the general category—Schwarzbier and bocks—are offering them in taprooms and in package, and consumers are slowly adding them to their drinking repertoire, some even becoming devoted fans.

Traditional lagers are often referred to as refreshing. With moderate abv and often bright golden in color their appearance and flavors are like sunshine and quench thirst on the warmest of days and lend to good times at sporting events or the outdoors.

When darker malts are added to the recipe, the perception can change, but shouldn't.

Darker malts can add toasty or nutty flavors and aromas to these styles while still retaining an overall crispness and refreshing character. Their addition also greatly enhances its relationship with food. From grilled items to raw seafood and fresh fruits, the touch of toasted bread and sometimes slight sweet chocolate or light coffee

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notes, greatly expand their depth.

Bocks are also becoming more popular among brewers and drinkers. Typically of moderate strength and malt-forward, these are rich, and a style of beer that often evoke the thought of "liquid bread." Nutty and satisfying, stronger versions are known as doppelbocks and are well suited for big roasts starchy dishes.

Then there are Baltic porters, these are often big boozy beers that offer higher abv and a bit of oomph with each sip. Often designed for colder nights, there is a certain pleasure in enjoying them with grilled summer and autumn foods, or around a campfire after a long day of activity.

Some brewers are even barrel-aging this style, boosting up the booze content and adding layers of whisky and other spirits to an already complex beer.

Give the category a try and experiment with the different styles, chances are you'll find one that speaks to your palate and slides into any situation you might find yourself in.

95 Wayfinder Gravity Drop (Baltic Porter; Wayfinder Beer, OR). Smooth and full bodied with a touch of prickly carbonation and a bit of dark chocolate fudge atop espresso, this baltic porter brings on herbal, slightly citrusy hop flavors mid-palate. It has a robustness that stands up to assertive cheeses on a charcuterie plate, but also works as a post-shift pint to bring some calm to the day.
